Applicants should complement the research activities of the Faculty of Social Sciences and contribute to interdisciplinary collaborative research projects within and outside TU Dortmund University. Experience in raising third-party funds is expected.

An appropriate contribution to the faculty's curriculum is expected – in the medium term also in German language.

The successful candidate will possess social and leadership skills and be willing to be involved in academic self-governance.
